Potsdam, the capital of Brandenburg and situated on the Havel River, southwest of Berlin, is particularly known for his history as residence of the Prussian kings. The city features a series of interconnected lakes and has an unique cultural landscape shaped by the parks and palaces of Sanssouci part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site. Further popular sights are the Brandenburg Gate of Potsdam (photo), built in 1770, the two-street Dutch Quarter (photo) - an ensemble of buildings in Dutch style that is unique in Europe - and the Palace Cecilienhof (photo), part of the New Garden and the place, where the Potsdam Conference after World War 2 in 1945 was held.

The Potsdam district of Babelsberg also serves as one of the leading centers of European film production. The Filmstudio Babelsberg has significant historical value as the oldest large-scale film studio in the world.

Potsdam, historically a centre of European immigration, attracted people from France, Russia, the Netherlands, and Bohemia due to its religious tolerance. This is still visible in the culture and architecture of the city.

Since the 19th century the city developed into a center of science in Germany. Today there are 3 public High schools and more than 30 research institutes in Potsdam.
